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Message du président et fondateur

Alors que la WPC se réunit pour la quatrième fois à Abu-Dhabi, où en sommes-nous?

Rien ne permet actuellement même d'entrevoir la fin du djihadisme et du terrorisme. Les derniers événements en Syrie viennent de nous le rappeler. Ce qui cependant retient le plus l'attention depuis notre dernière rencontre est la guerre qui s'est ouverte le 7 octobre 2023. Elle est maintenant largement entrée dans sa seconde année. On se trouve probablement face à une bifurcation, si par exemple Israël décidait d'annexer la Cisiordanie et d'intervenir en Iran sans ou peut être avec les Etats-Unis. Il est difficile de prévoir dans ce cas les conséquences qui pourraient en résulter dans la région et au-delà. Peut-on imaginer sérieusement une deuxième voie, dont le point de départ serait une ouverture d'Israël vers le retour du scénario des deux Etats (israélien et palestinien) qui avait émergé des accords d'Oslo de 1993 puis capoté à la suite de l'assassinat d'Itzhak Rabin ? Ce second scénario aurait évidemment la faveur des pays arabes qui aspirent à la paix et à la prospérité. En tout état de cause, un pays jouera un rôle fondamental pour orienter le cours de l'histoire dans la région : l'Iran. Ces sujets seront abondamment discutés au cours de cette conférence.

Pour l'évolution de la guerre russo-ukrainienne aussi, on peut distinguer au moins deux grands scénarios. Selon le premier, un processus de négociations s'engagerait plus ou moins rapidement après l'installation du président Donald Trump à la Maison Blanche, dont la première étape permettrait d'aboutir à un cessez-le-feu préalable à l'établissement d'une paix consolidée dans la région, ouvrant potentiellement la voie à la reconstruction d'un système de sécurité européen. Quoigu'il arrive, ce ne serait que le début d'un processus de longue durée et semé d'embuches. Selon le deuxième scénario, au'on ne peut pas exclure, le conflit s'étendrait au niveau de l'OTAN, ce qui poserait clairement la question de l'utilisation de l'arme nucléaire. Peut-on faire confiance à la sagesse des principaux acteurs de ce drame pour juger qu'on n'en arrivera pas là?

En ce qui concerne la rivalité entre les Etats-Unis et la Chine, tout suggère actuellement que ni les Chinois eux-mêmes, ni les Américains ne souhaitent prendre le risque d'une vraie guerre, même s'ils s'y préparent. Ce qui est certain, c'est qu'à moins d'une crise intérieure majeure en Chine actuellement difficilement

concevable, le régime communiste continuera de revendiquer l'appartenance de Taïwan à la RPC, comme il l'a toujours fait depuis son établissement en 1949. A cette fin, il joue et il jouera comme dans le jeu de go, notamment en investissant la mer de Chine orientale et méridionale. Les analystes américains sont conscients des effets dévastateurs pour le monde entier d'une vraie guerre entre les deux superpuissances. Concrètement, la confrontation entre les deux pays se concentre actuellement le plus visiblement sur les affaires technologiques et commerciales. Nous aurons aussi à en analyser les perspectives.

J'ajouterai un mot au sujet de l'Union européenne, dont l'affaiblissement est notoire depuis la chute de l'Union soviétique. Depuis sa naissance, elle est restée intimement liée aux Etats-Unis qui, de leur côté, ont toujours parlé des « institutions euro-atlantiques » comme constituant un tout. Il est vraisemblable qu'une nouvelle ère s'annonce avec le retour de Donald Trump, dont l'attention devrait se concentrer sur la Chine et sur l'économie. La protection américaine en Europe ne sera plus assurée dans les mêmes conditions. La nouvelle période qui s'ouvre sera décisive pour l'avenir de l'union transatlantique et donc celui de l'Union européenne elle-même. On dit, parfois à juste titre, que les grands chocs sont l'occasion des grands renouveaux. Nous sommes nombreux à l'espérer, car une Union européenne forte est dans l'intérêt de chacun de ses membres mais aussi, i'en suis convaincu, du monde entier. En raison de son histoire et de sa civilisation, cette union a en effet vocation à devenir un facteur équilibrant majeur pour l'avènement d'un nouveau système international plus favorable à la paix et à la prospérité.

Tels sont quelques-uns des thèmes majeurs pour la compréhension de l'état du monde, conjointement avec ceux qui tournent autour de l'économie et de la technologie. L'enjeu principal, aujourd'hui, est d'éviter tout dérapage vers une division du monde en blocs et une Troisième Guerre mondiale. Fidèle à sa mission, la WPC entend mettre en valeur la contribution des puissances moyennes pour préserver les chances d'une gouvernance mondiale adaptée au franchissement pacifique des obstacles auxquels nous devons faire face et au sauvetage des biens communs de la planète.

Message from the Chairman and Founder

As the WPC convenes in Abu Dhabi for the fourth time, where do things stand?

At present, there is no end to jihadism and terrorism in sight. The latest events in Syria have just reminded us of that. What has captured the most attention since our last meeting, however, is the war that began on October 7. 2023, now well into its second year. We will probably face a bifurcation in the road if, for example, Israel decides to annex the West Bank and intervene in Iran without or perhaps with the United States. If that happens, it is hard to foresee what the consequences might be in the region and beyond. Can a second way be seriously imagined, one whose starting point would be Israel's openness to the two-State solution that emerged from the 1993 Oslo accords before collapsing after Yitzhak Rabin's assassination? The second way would obviously have the support of Arab countries aspiring to peace and prosperity. In any case, the only certainty is that one country will play a key role in shaping the course of the region's history: Iran. These topics will be discussed at length during the conference.

At least two main scenarios can also be envisaged for the course of Russia's war in Ukraine. In the first, a negotiating process would begin more or less soon after Donald Trump moves back into the White House. This would lead to a ceasefire prior to the establishment of a consolidated peace in the region, potentially clearing the way for the reconstruction of a European security system. Whatever happens, it would only be the beginning of a long-term process full of pitfalls. The second scenario, which can not be ruled out, would be an escalation of the conflict. and its expansion to NATO, whith the possible use of nuclear weapons. Can the wisdom of the main players in this tragedy be trusted to keep us from reaching that point?

With regard to the rivalry between the United States and China, everything suggests that neither side wants to risk an all-out war, although they are preparing for one. Unless there is a major domestic crisis in China, which is presently highly doubtful, the Communist regime will certainly continue to claim that Taiwan is an integral part of the PRC, as it has done since its establishment in 1949. To this end, it plays and will continue to play a game of Go, notably by raising the stakes in the East and South China Sea. American analysts are aware of the devastating effects that an all-out

war between the two superpowers would have on the entire world. Right now, the confrontation between them is most visibly focused on technology and trade. We will also have to analyse those prospects.

I will add a word about the European Union, which has weakened significantly since the fall of the Soviet Union. Since its creation, it has remained closely connected to the United States, which has always spoken of "Euro-Atlantic institutions" as a whole. It is probable that a new era will begin with the return of Trump, whose focus is likely to be on China and the American economy. The United States will no longer protect Europe in the same conditions. The new period opening up will be decisive for the future of the transatlantic union and therefore that of the European Union itself. It is said, sometimes rightly, that great shocks are an opportunity for great new beginnings. Many of us hope so, because a strong European Union is in the interest of all its members, but also, I am convinced, of the world as a whole. Due to its history and civilization, the Union is destined to become an important equilibrating factor in the advent of a new international system more favourable to peace and prosperity.

These are some of the major themes for understanding the state of the world, along with those involving the economy and technology. Today's main challenge is to avoid a division of the world into blocs and a Third World War. True to its mission, the WPC intends to highlight the middle-sized powers' contribution to preserving the chances of a global governance geared towards peacefully overcoming the hurdles facing us and saving the planet's common goods.

La gouvernance économique mondiale dans un monde fragmenté

Que signifie exactement aujourd'hui la gouvernance mondiale? Le monde a hérité des institutions de Bretton-Woods. De nombreuses organisations se sont rajoutées progressivement par la suite comme le G7 en 1976, le G20, et diverses organisations régionales tels que les BRICS. D'autre part, la Chine s'intéresse à ce qui pourrait devenir une architecture concurrentielle de la gouvernance. Est-il concevable qu'émerge de cet ensemble de plus en plus confus une véritable gouvernance mondiale, alors que le système international se fragmente.

SESSION PLÉNIÈRE 2 Démondialisation ou remondialisation ?

Cette deuxième session est le prolongement naturel de la première. Le projet de mondialisation libérale a dominé dans les vingt années autour de l'an 2000. Il est maintenant remis en cause. Les tendances protectionnistes classiques s'affirment ouvertement ainsi que les politiques industrielles des principales puissances qui risquent de s'entrechoquer et de déstabiliser un peu plus encore l'économie internationale. La notion à la mode de de-risking ne risquet-elle pas d'aggraver la fragmentation ? Est-il concevable et possible de mettre un terme à ce processus et de reconstruire un système économique international « raisonnablement ouvert » et structurellement stable ?

Des politiques étrangères multi-vectorielles ?

Le concept de non-alignement a disparu avec celui de Tiers-Monde et la fin de la guerre froide. Sous l'impulsion initiale de l'Inde, il a été remplacé par celui de « multialignement », auquel le Kazakhstan se réfère sous le nom de « multivectorialité ». Un nombre croissant de pays qui n'appartenaient pas nécessairement au Tiers-Monde d'autrefois y a désormais recours sous une forme ou sous une autre, comme la Turquie membre de l'Otan et candidate à l'Union européenne ou sur le continent européen au sens propre la Hongrie ou la Serbie.

PLENARY SESSION 1: Global Economic Governance in a Fragmented World

What does global governance truly mean today? The world has inherited the Bretton Woods institutions. Numerous organizations have gradually been added since then, such as the G7 in 1976, the G20, and various regional organizations such as the BRICS. On the other hand, China has undertaken what could become a competing governance architecture. Is it conceivable that genuine global governance could emerge from this increasingly confused landscape, even as the international system becomes more fragmented?

De-globalization or Re-globalization?

This second session is the natural extension of the first one. The project of liberal globalization dominated the two decades around the year 2000. It is now clearly failing. Traditional protectionist tendencies are openly asserting themselves, as are the industrial policies of major powers, which risk clashing and further destabilizing the international economy. Isn't the fashionable notion of "de-risking" likely to worsen fragmentation? Is it conceivable and possible to put an end to this process and rebuild an international economic system that is "reasonably open" and structurally stable?

PLENARY SESSION 3 Multi-vector Foreign Policies?

The concept of non-alignment disappeared along with that of the Third World and the end of the Cold War. Initially driven by India, it has been replaced by the concept of "multi-alignment," which Kazakhstan refers to as "multivectoriality." A growing number of countries, not necessarily belonging to the former Third World, now refer to this approach in one form or another, such as Turkiye, a NATO member and candidate for the European Union, or in the European continent proper, Hungary or Serbia.

session plénière 5 Le rôle du G7 dans un paysage en mutation

La création du G7 en 1976 à l'initiative du président français Giscard d'Estaing est apparue à l'époque très originale. Elle mettait en effet en prise directe les leaders de quelques-uns des principaux pays de l'époque. Cependant, dès l'origine, la question s'est posée de la légitimé de sa composition. À l'heure où certains États manifestent leur souhait de participer à ce club, le moment paraît propice pour s'interroger à nouveau sur sa composition et son efficacité.

La géopolitique du changement climatique

Les efforts de la communauté internationale pour atteindre l'objectif zéro émission nette ont déclenché une transition énergétique hors des énergies fossiles sans précédent, mais inégale.

Après les engagements historiques de l'Accord de Paris (2015) et de la COP28 des Émirats arabes unis, le chemin à parcourir est encore long.

La technologie et l'innovation sont et resteront les principaux moteurs de la décarbonation. Les avancées en matière d'énergies renouvelables, de stockage de l'énergie, d'hydrogène propre, de séquestration du carbone et de solutions naturelles sont essentiels pour atteindre l'objectif zéro émission nette et, à terme, devenir « climatiquement positif ». Toutefois, la mise à l'échelle de ces technologies demande des investissements considérables et une collaboration entre les secteurs public et privé dans le cadre de politiques efficaces.

Durant notre discussion, nous examinerons également le rôle du financement climatique dans la mise en œuvre de solutions efficaces. Par ailleurs, les parties prenantes doivent prendre en compte les risques géopolitiques liés à la dépendance à l'égard des ressources et gérer les complexités de l'équité et de la sécurité énergétiques. Dans ce contexte, nous nous pencherons sur les avantages du « greenshoring » (relocalisation à visée environnementale) pour réduire les risques liés aux chaînes d'approvisionnement mondiales.

The purpose of this session is to clarify the meaning and viability of this concept in a fragmented and heterogeneous international system, which must remain, to use one of the fundamental ideas of the WPC, reasonably open.

PLENARY SESSION 4

Conversation between Ryu Jin, Chairman of the Federation of Korean Industries and Kevin McCarthy, 55th Speaker of the United States House of Representatives

The Role of G7 in a Changing Landscape

The creation of the G7 in 1976 at the initiative of French President Giscard d'Estaing appeared very innovative at the time. It indeed brought into direct contact the leaders of some of the main countries of the time. However, from the outset, the question of the legitimacy of its composition arose. At a time when certain states are legitimately expressing their desire to participate in this club, the moment seems opportune to reconsider its composition and effectiveness.

PLENARY SESSION 6 Geopolitics of Climate Change

The international community's efforts to achieve net zero emissions have triggered an unprecedented yet uneven energy transition away from fossil fuels.

Following the landmark agreements of the Paris Accord (2015) and the UAE COP28, a lot of progress remains ahead of us.

Technology and innovation are and will remain key drivers for decarbonization. Advances in renewable energies, energy storage, clean hydrogen, carbon sequestration and natural solutions are essential to achieving net zero emissions and ultimately climate positivity.

However, scaling up these technologies requires significant investment and collaboration between public and private sectors through effective policies.

During our panel discussion, we will also look at the role of climate finance in implementing effective solutions as well. At the same time, stakeholders need to consider the geopolitical risks of resource dependence and manage the complexities of energy equity and security. In this context, the benefits of green shoring to derisk global supply chains will be discussed.

Le Corridor économique (IMEC) : une nouvelle ère de coopération et de croissance mondiale

L'India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC) est un projet de couloir économique et logistique reliant l'Asie à l'Europe, à travers Moyen-Orient. Annoncé en marge du Sommet du G20 de New Delhi en septembre 2023 par une coalition de huit participants qui ont alors signé un protocole d'entente : l'Inde, les Émirats arabes unis, l'Arabie saoudite, la France, l'Allemagne, l'Italie les États-Unis et l'Union européenne, l'IMEC pourrait être l'un des plus grands projets d'infrastructure du XXIème siècle. Sa visée transformationnelle s'inscrit aussi bien dans les nouveaux défis de méga-projets de connectivité que dans un contexte géostratégique ayant drastiquement changé au Moyen-Orient depuis le début de la querre à Gaza.

Pour aborder ces multiples enjeux, cette table ronde rassemblera des acteurs clés des secteurs public, privé et de la société civile des différents pays concernés. Ils mettront en perspective à la fois la dimension stratégique de cette nouvelle route, et les espoirs qu'elle suscite pour devenir un projet de paix et développement économique.

Présidée par Monsieur Gérard Mestrallet, Envoyé spécial du Président de la République l'IMEC depuis novembre 2023, ce panel accueillera également Monsieur Anurag Varma, Senior Vice-President Public Affairs and Business Development d'Adani North America, basé Washington, qui exposera la vision de l'un des principaux conglomérats indiens; Monsieur Gidon Bromberg, fondateur de l'ONG EcoPeace Middle East qui travaille sur le processus de paix au Proche-Orient autour d'équipes basée en Jordanie, Palestine et Israël. Il introduira leurs récents travaux prospectifs portant sur l'insertion de l'IMEC dans le concept de « triangle de la paix ».

The IMEC Economic Corridor: A New Era of Global Cooperation and Growth

The India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC) is a project of new economic and logistics corridor aimed at enhancing connectivity across three continents. Announced on the sidelines of the G20 Summit in New Delhi in September 2023 by a coalition of eight participants which released a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU): India, the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, France, Germany, Italy, the United States and the European Union, IMEC could be one of the largest infrastructure projects of the 21st century.

Like other major connectivity projects, this new corridor is facing practical challenges as well as a political equation which drastically changed in the Middle East since the beginning of the war in Gaza. To address these multiple issues, this round table brings together key players from the public, private sectors, and civil society from the different countries crossed by the route to put into perspective geostrategic dimension of this corridor which could both be an instrument for economic development and peace.

Chaired by Mr. Gérard Mestrallet, French President Special Envoy for IMEC since November 2023, this panel will also gather Mr. Anurag Varma, Senior Vice-President Public Affairs and Business Development of Adani North America, based in Washington, who will share the vision one of the main Indian conglomerate; and Mr. Gidon Bromberg, founder of the NGO EcoPeace Middle East which works on the peace process with teams based in Jordan, Palestine and Israel. He will introduce their recent prospective work on the insertion of the IMEC into the concept of the "peace triangle".

La croissance économique et les défis géopolitiques en Asie

Le développement de l'Asie comme la grande nouveauté économique au XXIe siècle, largement prédite dès le milieu du XXe, est aujourd'hui une réalité presque banale. Ce qui l'est moins, c'est l'accumulation de problèmes géopolitiques complexes régionaux ou de plus en plus à portée mondiale en raison du développement de la Chine. Est-il possible de formuler avec clarté les grands enjeux de ce phénomène qui interfère inévitablement avec les mutations en cours dans le monde occidental et en Russie ?

L'avenir de l'Europe après la guerre d'Ukraine et l'élection de Trump

Presque trois ans depuis le début de la guerre d'Ukraine, il est temps de sortir des discours convenus et de s'interroger sur les conditions probables de la fin d'un conflit qui n'a que trop duré. Dans quel état, tant sur le plan politique qu'économique, se trouvera l'Union européenne quand la paix sera rétablie? Une réorganisation en profondeur de cette Union est-elle nécessaire et possible? Comment peut-on se représenter l'évolution de la relation transatlantique sous la nouvelle présidence de Donald Trump, alors que l'Europe se trouvera affaiblie et face à la nécessité d'investir des montants considérables dans la défense, le changement climatique, ou encore la reconstruction de l'Ukraine?

Economic Growth and Geopolitical Challenges in Asia

PLENARY SESSION 9

The development of Asia as the major economic phenomenon of the 21st century, widely predicted since the mid-20th century, is now an almost undeniable reality. What is less common is the accumulation of complex geopolitical problems, regional or increasingly global in scope, due to the development of China. Is it possible to clearly articulate the major issues of this phenomenon, which inevitably interferes with the ongoing transformations in the Western world and Russia?

The Future of Europe After the Ukraine War and Trump's Election

Nearly three years since the beginning of the war in Ukraine, it's time to move beyond conventional rhetoric and question the likely conditions for ending a conflict that has lasted far too long. In what state, both politically and economically, will the European Union emerge when peace is restored? Is a profound reorganization of this Union necessary and feasible? How can we envision the evolution of the transatlantic relationship under Donald Trump's new presidency, especially as Europe will be weakened and facing the necessity of investing significantly in defense, climate change, and the reconstruction of Ukraine?

session plénière 11 La révolution de l'IA et au-delà

L'essor spectaculaire de l'IA ces dernières années et l'explosion phénoménale de ChatGPT auprès du grand public se sont accompagnés d'un tourbillon d'activités politiques, financières et juridiques, ainsi que d'un tsunami de commentaires, de mises en garde et de prédictions. S'il existe un large consensus sur le potentiel transformateur de l'IA et sur la nécessité pour les États et les entreprises d'en tirer le meilleur parti, les désaccords sont vifs sur l'évolution et les orientations futures du domaine de l'IA. Les grands modèles de langage et l'IA générative poursuivront-ils leur progression ou atteignent-ils un plateau technique et/ou économique, alors que les agents IA, la nouvelle source d'exaltation de ce secteur, jouent désormais les premiers rôles ? L'intelligence artificielle générale est-elle à portée de main ou nécessitera-t-elle une percée conceptuelle ? Quel degré d'autonomie les systèmes artificiels peuvent-ils atteindre et vers quel objectif devonsnous tendre ? Si l'avenir de la technologie soulève ce type de questions, les capacités actuelles des systèmes d'IA et la structure actuelle du secteur posent des défis urgents. D'une part, des appels à une mobilisation générale en faveur d'une IA bienfaitrice, diane de confiance et éthique ont été lancés il y a plusieurs années, et d'innombrables centres et initiatives ambitionnent de faire de ce rêve une réalité. D'autre part, l'IA peut causer et cause des ravages dans de nombreux domaines, en raison de ses limites actuelles, des effets systémiques ou des manœuvres hostiles d'agents malveillants. Des garde-fous juridiques ont été mis en place, mais ils sont ébranlés par les appels à la liberté d'innovation et les activités de lobbying du secteur. Alors que l'IA transforme de nombreux domaines, de l'éducation à la médecine, de la guerre à la justice, de la finance à la politique, etc., les conditions précises de son déploiement raisonné et ses effets globaux sont loin d'être clairs. L'impact de l'IA sur l'emploi et sur les inégalités entre les membres d'une société et entre les sociétés suscite de vifs débats. La qualité de la vie quotidienne, la résilience du tissu social, la durabilité des infrastructures colossales requises par l'IA sont autant de préoccupations auxquelles il est urgent de répondre dès aujourd'hui. La destruction n'est pas nécessairement créatrice. Nous n'avons aucune certitude en la matière : force est de reconnaître que nous sommes entrés dans une ère de profonde incertitude, amplifiée par, et amplifiant, les transformations à l'œuvre partout dans le monde. Nous ne pouvons cependant pas rester les bras croisés à attendre et voir ce qui va se passer : l'IA est un produit de l'action humaine et nous devons tout mettre en œuvre pour faire un état des lieux précis de la situation actuelle et définir une vision claire de la direction à

The Al Revolution and Beyond

IThe impressive development of AI over the last few years and the phenomenal burst of ChatGPT onto public awareness have been accompanied by a flurry of political, financial, legal activity, in conjunction with a tsunami of commentaries, warnings and predictions. While there is broad agreement regarding the transformative potential of AI and the need for both states and firms to take full advantage of it, there are sharp disagreements on what comes next and which directions the field ought to take. Will large language models and generative AI keep progressing or are they reaching a technical and/or economic plateau, while AI agents, the latest source of excitement in the industry, take the lead? Is general machine intelligence within reach or will it require a conceptual breakthrough? How much autonomy can artificial systems achieve, and how much should we aim for? While the future of the technology raises this kind of issue, the present abilities of AI systems and the present structure of the industry pose pressing challenges. On the one hand, general calls for a beneficent, trustworthy, ethical AI have been issued years ago, and countless centers and initiatives aim at making this dream come true. On the other hand, Al can and does wreak havoc in many areas, whether due to its present limitations, to systemic effects or to hostile maneuvers of malicious agents. Legal guardrails have been set up but are blunted by calls for freedom of innovation and lobbying efforts of the industry. While AI is changing many areas, from education to medicine, from war to justice, from finance to politics, etc., the precise conditions of its wise deployment and its overall effects are anything but obvious. The impact on employment and inequalities within and between societies are hotly debated. The quality of everyday life, the resilience of the social fabric, the sustainability of colossal infrastructures required by Al are concerns that need to be addressed now rather than tomorrow. Destruction is not necessarily creative. There are no certainties to be had on any of these issues: we must acknowledge that we have entered an era of deep uncertainty, amplified by and amplifying the ongoing transformations of the world at large. Yet we cannot simply wait and see: Al is a product of human gaency and we must strive to gain the best possible perspective on where we stand and where we need to go.

Leaders innovants – Transformer les entreprises avec l'IA générative

Au cours des deux dernières années, l'IA générative apparait comme l'innovation la plus disruptive depuis Internet, ce qui expliquerait pourquoi c'est désormais un sujet à l'agenda de 96 % des conseils d'administration Les investissements massifs réalisés par les big Tech ainsi que par l'industrie du capital-risque favorisent l'émergence d'un écosystème foisonnant de startups au développement rapide, par delà Chat GPT, l'application grand public d'Open Al qui a connu une adoption record.

Dans ce panel, nous accueillerons plusieurs startups pour illustrer ce que l'IA générative peut apporter aux entreprises dans des domaines tels que le développement logiciel, les co-pilotes, mais aussi comment le modèle de fondation basé sur les réseaux neuronaux liquides va contribuer à la révolution de l'IA générative. Sera également évoquée la perspective de l'OCDE sur le rythme rapide des développements de l'IA générative et les enjeux correspondants pour les régulateurs.

L'expansion des BRICS : implications pour l'avenir de l'ordre mondial

Dans le courant de l'année, cinq pays connus collectivement sous le nom de BRICS (Brésil, Russie, Inde, Chine et Afrique du Sud) ont accueilli cinq nouvelles nations dans leur giron. Avec l'adhésion de ces nouveaux membres que sont l'Égypte, l'Éthiopie, l'Iran, l'Arabie saoudite et les Émirats arabes unis, les BRICS+ élarais représentent désormais un auart du commerce mondial et près de la moitié de la population de la planète. Leur poids ne manguera pas de s'accroître avec les candidatures en attente d'une douzaine d'autres pays. Reste à savoir si le groupe des BRICS parviendra à exploiter efficacement son pouvoir collectif. Des rivaux géopolitiques féroces (l'Arabie saoudite et l'Iran) et des pays aux relations tendues (la Chine et l'Inde) doivent apprendre à coopérer au sein de ce groupe. Cet élargissement a néanmoins des implications considérables pour une multitude d'industries et de dirigeants d'entreprise plus habitués à naviguer dans un monde où les institutions dirigées par l'Occident fixent dans une large mesure les règles du jeu depuis des décennies. L'expansion des BRICS+ constitue une étape importante vers la construction d'un monde multipolaire. Les dirigeants d'entreprise qui en ont conscience et qui préparent leur organisation en conséquence ont bien plus de chances de la voir prospérer dans le paysage commercial mondial émergent que de rester à la traîne.

PLENARY SESSION 12

Innovative Leaders – Transforming Business with Generative Al

Over the last 2 years, Generative AI has emerged as the most disruptive innovation since internet, explaining why 96% of Boards now have it on their agenda. The massive investments made by big Tech players along the Venture Capital industry are fostering a full ecosystem of rapidly developing startups, well beyond OpenAI's fastest-growing consumer software application ever with ChatGPT.

In this plenary session, we will be hosting innovative startups that illustrate the Generative AI promise in the enterprise context in domains such as software coding and next big breakthrough Agentic AI, but also what alternative foundational models like liquid neural network technology can bring to the Generative AI revolution. The OECD perspective regarding Generative AI evolving at breakneck pace will further outline areas of interest and concerns for regulators and policy makers.

PLENARY SESSION 13

Brics Expansion: Implications for the Future of Global Order

Earlier this year, five countries collectively known as the BRICS - Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa welcomed five more nations into their fold. Thanks to newly minted members Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE, the expanded BRICS+ now represents one-quarter of global trade and nearly half of the world's population. That footprint will surely grow with applications pending from a dozen other countries. How effectively the group harnesses its collective power is an open question. Fierce geopolitical rivals (Saudi Arabia and Iran), and countries with strained relations (China and India) must learn to cooperate within its ranks. Nevertheless, the expansion harbors considerable implications for a multitude of industries and chief executives more accustomed to navigating a world in which Western-led institutions have largely set the ground rules for decades. An expanding BRICS+ is a significant milestone in the advance towards a multipolar world. CEOs who recognize that and prepare their organizations are far more likely to prosper in the emerging global business landscape than be left behind by it.

session plénière 15 Les défis mondiaux de la santé

La session sur la santé mondiale de cette année portera largement sur la question de la prévention. La prévention reste le parent pauvre des systèmes de santé, n'intéresse que peu le politique, les grandes institutions de santé mondiale et même la population qui, pourtant, attend de la santé publique qu'elle la protège.

L'action publique bénéficie de progrès considérables dans le domaine des interventions en prévention. L'efficacité de la vaccination dans la prévention et la réduction des maladies infectieuses ne devrait ainsi laisser place à aucun doute.

Les systèmes de santé ne peuvent cependant se substituer aux choix individuels si essentiels dans le domaine de la prévention. La prévention du sida a ainsi transformé la façon dont nous concevons la prévention d'une vision hygiéniste en une vision ou la personne se trouve en position de co-responsabilité de la santé de la communauté.

La prévention s'adresse à des menaces qui nous concernent tous (l'idée selon laquelle le coronavirus nous affecte tous sans faire de différences a ainsi été utile pour susciter l'adhésion de la société aux mesures de prévention), mais l'action en prévention devra néanmoins savoir se concentrer sur les plus vulnérables au risque, autrement dit, intégrer les déterminants sociaux, culturels et économiques de la santé au-delà de la seule cible médicale.

La session de cette année envisagera un panorama des questions que soulève la prévention ; les enjeux politiques et économiques ; la prévention du risque pandémique ; l'impact du changement climatique sur la santé ; la vision de la prévention en Afrique au moment ou les sujets santé sont devenus une priorité politique continentale.

PLENARY SESSION 15 Global Health Challenges

This year's session on global health will focus primarily on the issue of prevention.

Prevention remains the poor relation of health systems. It is of little interest to politicians, major global health institutions or even the public, who nevertheless expect public healthcare services to protect them.

Public health action is benefiting from considerable progress in the field of prevention, and the effectiveness of vaccination in preventing and reducing outbreaks of infectious diseases should leave no room for doubt.

However, healthcare systems are no substitute for individual choices, which are essential when it comes to prevention. AIDS prevention, for example, has transformed the way in which we view prevention, moving from a position of personal protection to one in which the individual shares responsibility for the health of the community.

Prevention seeks to address threats that affect us all (the idea that the coronavirus affects us all without distinction has been useful in getting society to support preventive measures), but preventive action must nevertheless be able to focus on those most vulnerable to the risk, in other words, to integrate the social, cultural and economic determiners of health beyond the medical goal alone.

This year's session will present an overview of the issues raised by prevention; the political and economic stakes; pandemic risk prevention; the impact of climate change on health; and the vision of prevention in Africa at a time when health issues have become a continent-wide political priority.

SESSION PLÉNIÈRE 16 Géopolitique, alimentation et faim dans le monde : un sujet oublié et explosif

Les nouvelles qui nous viennent du front de l'alimentation mondiale en 2024 n'ont pas été très bonnes. Certes, un bon nombre de prix agricoles ont été orientés à la baisse, ce dont les consommateurs ont profité. Ceci reflète le reflux de l'inflation sur les intrants, l'accroissement de l'offre et une meilleure gestion des conséquences politiques sur les pays pauvres du conflit russo-ukrainien. Evidemment, les tendances ont été très disparates suivant les productions et les pays. Pour les producteurs de cacao, par exemple, 2024 aura été une année bénie! Ceci n'a cependant pas eu une influence notable, à court terme, sur des paramètres profonds sociaux et géopolitiques.

Sur le plan social, la FAO nous précise qu'environ 760 millions de personnes pourraient avoir connu la faim en 2023 - soit 1 personne sur 11 dans le monde et 1 sur 5 en Afrique, où elle continue d'augmenter, contrairement aux progrès notables enregistrés dans la région Amérique latine et Caraïbes. Malgré ces derniers, la prévalence de l'insécurité alimentaire modérée ou arave est restée inchangée au niveau mondial pendant trois années consécutives. La FAO estime qu'en 2023, l'insécurité alimentaire modérée ou grave touchait 29 % de la population mondiale, soit 2,33 milliards de personnes. Plus d'un tiers des personnes dans le monde, ne peuvent se permettre une alimentation saine, ce qui est le cas pour 71 % de la population des pays à faible revenu. 582 millions de personnes devraient être en situation de sous-alimentation chronique à la fin de la décennie, plus de la moitié d'entre elles en Afrique.

Sur le plan géopolitique, la carte des dépendances n'évolue guère non plus, dessinant des rapports de force durables. Le commerce mondial des denrées alimentaires a augmenté selon l'OMC et la CNUCED de 350% en vingt ans. Il s'élèverait à 3600 milliards US de valeur ajoutée. Les Etats-Unis, le Brésil ou encore les Pays-Bas en sont les principaux bénéficiaires, tandis que la Chine et le Japon enregistrent la plus forte

PLENARY SESSION 16 Geopolitics, Food, World Hunger: A Forgotten and Explosive Subject

The news coming out of the global food front in 2024

has not been very good. Admittedly, a good number of agricultural prices have been moving downwards, which has benefited consumers. This reflects the decline in input inflation, the increase in supply and better management of the political consequences on poor countries of the Russia-Ukraine conflict. Obviously, the trends have been very disparate depending on the production and the country. For cocoa farmers, for example, 2024 will have been a blessed year! However, this has not had a significant influence, in the short term, on deep social and geopolitical parameters. On the social front, the FAO tells us that about 760 million people may have experienced hunger in 2023 - 1 in 11 people in the world and 1 in 5 in Africa, where it continues to increase, in contrast to the notable progress recorded in the Latin America and Caribbean region. Despite these changes, the prevalence of moderate to severe food insecurity has remained unchanged globally for three consecutive vears. FAO estimates that in 2023, moderate or severe food insecurity affected 29% of the world's population, or 2.33 billion people. More than a third of the world's people cannot afford a healthy diet, which is the case for 71% of the population in low-income countries. 582 million people are expected to be chronically undernourished by the end of the decade, more than half of them in Africa

On the geopolitical level, the map of dependencies has hardly changed either, drawing lasting power relations. According to the WTO and UNCTAD, world trade in food has increased by 350% in twenty years. It would amount to 3600 billion US in added value. The United States, Brazil and the Netherlands are the main beneficiaries, while China and Japan have the highest

Face à ces défis, il est frappant que la mobilisation internationale demeure modeste. En 2024, nous aurons connu trois grandes conférences des parties (COP) portant sur le climat, la biodiversité et la désertification ainsi que la négociation d'un nouveau grand traité international sur le plastique. Les sujets garicoles seront demeurés marainaux voire inexistants dans le menu de ces réunions, alors que l'agriculture, dans laquelle travaille le quart de la main d'œuvre planétaire, est à la fois un problème massif dans chacun des sujets traités par elles et une solution de premier rang. La COP 29 sur le climat a permis de constater que seuls 3% des financements climats sont orientés vers l'agriculture à l'échelle mondiale. 62% des contributions nationales climat des pays industrialisés ne mentionnent pas le sujet. Seuls 4% des besoins financiers identifiés par les pays en développement dans leurs engagements climats sont orientés vers la transformation et la résilience des systèmes alimentaires.

La faiblesse de cette mobilisation est-elle légitime au regard des menaces que fait peser le changement climatique sur l'alimentation mondiale, sur la persistance de la faim, sur les dépendances géopolitiques ? Devons nous craindre l'aggravation de pauvreté alimentaire structurelle et, un jour ou l'autre, une querre de la faim ou une querre de l'accès aux ressources? La technologie peut-elle changer totalement la donne, au moment où les perspectives de l'alimentation cellulaire semblent marquer le pas, et où aucune révolution verte ne se dessine (heureusement ?) à l'horizon ? L'agroécologie, au contraire, sauvera-t-elle le monde, mais à quels prix pour les consommateurs, ou revenus, pour les agriculteurs? Comment mettre ces sujets dont chacun voit l'importance essentielle pour notre futur sur la table du débat international 2

Politique et religion au Moyen-Orient

La plupart des experts s'accorde à situer l'émergence de l'islam politique en 1979, année de la révolution en Iran et du début de la guerre d'Afghanistan. Ce phénomène a pris une ampleur considérable depuis lors. L'objet de cette session est de réfléchir sur les causes et les effets de cette évolution fondamentale depuis maintenant un demi-siècle et plus généralement sur l'interférence croissante entre la politique et la religion.

dependence in terms of volume. But it is the poorest countries that are in fact in the most difficult strategic situation, even if African imports in the continent's share of production remain structurally in the same proportions, about 20% in gross and 6% in net. In this field, Europe and America have an undeniable position of strength, which must be put into perspective, however, by their own dependence on certain inputs and equipment. This is reflected in the importance of the support they provide to their agriculture, in particular through subsidies whose consequences for developing countries are negative: the record public spending on agricultural value added is the USA (25%), and Europe (22%)... compared to 10% for Africa!

In the face of these challenges, it is striking that international mobilization remains modest. In 2024, we will have had three major conferences of the parties (COPs) on climate, biodiversity and desertification, as well as the negotiation of a major new international treaty on plastics. Agricultural issues will have remained marginal or even non-existent on the agenda of these meetings, while agriculture, in which a quarter of the world's workforce works, is both a massive problem in each of the subjects dealt with by them and a first-rate solution. COP 29 on climate found that only 3% of climate finance is directed towards agriculture on a global scale. 62% of the national climate contributions of industrialized countries do not mention the subject. Only 4% of the financial needs identified by developing countries in their climate commitments are directed towards the transformation and resilience of food systems.

Is the weakness of this mobilization legitimate in view of the threats that climate change poses to the world's food supply, to the persistence of hunger, to geopolitical dependencies? Should we fear the worsening of structural food poverty and, one day or another, a hunger war or a war over access to resources? Can technology change the situation completely, at a time when the prospects for cellular power seem to be slowing down, and when no green revolution is (fortunately?) on the horizon? Will agroecology, on the contrary, save the world, but at what price for consumers, or incomes, for farmers? How can we put these subjects, which everyone sees as essential importance for our future, on the table of international debate?

PLENARY SESSION 17 Politics and Religion in the Middle East

Most experts agree that the emergence of political Islam dates back to 1979, the year of the Iranian revolution and the beginning of the war in Afghanistan. Since then, this phenomenon has gained considerable momentum. The goal of this session is to reflect o the causes and effects of this fundamental evolution over the past half-century and, more generally, on the growing interference between politics and religion.

SESSION PLÉNIÈRE 18 Quelles perspectives d'une paix durable israélo-arabe?

LLa guerre qui a débuté avec la razzia du Hamas contre Israël conduit à réexaminer les schémas d'une paix possible. Alors que la solution à deux États issue des accords d'Oslo était progressivement tombée dans l'oubli, de nombreux commentateurs et analystes la réexaminent aujourd'hui en vue de l'établissement d'une paix israélo-palestinienne et israélo-arabe durable. D'autres, plus pessimistes, craignent que cette guerre ne débouche sur une fausse paix et sur le retour d'autres phases de conflits de haute intensité dans les décennies à venir. Est-il possible de trancher entre ces deux perspectives ?

Guerre et paix au Moyen-Orient : quel rôle pour les Européens ?

Le cadre de la guerre au Moyen-Orient dépasse largement celui du conflit israélo-palestinien. Les causes en sont nombreuses. L'Iran est à cet égard un acteur majeur. L'objet de cette session est de réfléchir aux conditions qui permettraient d'espérer en l'établissement d'une paix durable sur l'ensemble du Moyen-Orient, et de s'interroger sur le rôle possible des européens à cette fin.

session plénière 20 Construire un avenir durable en Afrique

Selon les projections du scénario médian de la population mondiale du Département des affaires économiques et sociales des Nations unies, la Terre comptera 9.7 milliards d'habitants en 2050. Environ 22 % de la population mondiale, soit 2,118 milliards de personnes, vivront dans les 49 pays d'Afrique subsaharienne (ASS) en 2050, contre 1,4 milliard en 2030 et un peu moins de 1,1 milliard en 2019. D'ici à 2050, seule l'Afrique subsaharienne devrait encore enregistrer une croissance démographique rapide, appelée à se poursuivre jusqu'à la fin du XXIe siècle où la population devrait atteindre 3,775 milliards d'habitants. Quant à savoir si cela constituera un « dividende démographique » ou une « malédiction », tout dépendra de la capacité de l'Afrique à éduquer sa jeunesse et lui offrir des perspectives économiques, à renforcer la gouvernance, à réduire les conflits et à s'adapter aux menaces - sécheresses en dehors des tropiques et inondations plus près de l'équateur - que fait peser l'accélération du changement climatique. La Chine s'engage aux côtés de l'Afrique pour relever les défis du développement de l'Afrique à travers le Forum sur la coopération sino-africaine (FOCAC); les États-Unis à travers l'African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA - Loi sur la croissance et les opportunités en Afrique) ; et l'UE à travers le Partenariat Afrique-UE qui a adopté une « Vision commune pour 2030 » lors du 6e sommet

PLENARY SESSION 18 What Perspectives for a Sustainable Arab-Israeli Peace?

The war that began with Hamas's attack on Israel leads to a re-examination of possible peace scenarios. While the two-state solution resulting from the Oslo Accords had gradually fallen into oblivion, many commentators and analysts are revisiting it today with the hope of establishing a lasting Israeli-Palestinian and Israeli-Arab peace. Others, more pessimistic, fear that this war may lead to a false peace and the return of other phases of high-intensity conflicts in the coming decades. Is it possible to take a decision between these two perspectives?

War and Peace in the Middle East: What Role for the Europeans?

The context of the war in the Middle East extends far beyond the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. There are numerous causes, with Iran being a major player in this regards. The goal of this session is to reflect on the conditions that could foster hopes for establishing lasting peace throughout the Middle East, and to consider the possible role of Europeans in this effort.

PLENARY SESSION 20 Building a Sustainable Future in Africa

The medium variant projection of the World Population Projection of the UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs, suggests that there will be some 9.7 billion people on Earth in 2050. Some 22 percent of these, 2.118 bn people, will be in the 49 countries of sub-Saharan Africa (SSA) in 2050, having risen from 1.4 bn in 2030 and just less than 1.1 bn in 2019. By 2050, only SSA is expected still to have rapid population growth, continuing to the end of the 21st century, at which point the population is projected to be 3.775bn. Whether this will be a "demographic dividend" or a "curse" will depend on Africa's ability to educate and enable economic opportunity for its youth, to strengthen governance and reduce conflict, and to adapt to the threats - droughts outside the tropics and floods closer to the equator - posed by accelerating climate change. China engages with Africa in addressing Africa's developmental challenges through the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation (FOCAC); the U.S. though the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA); and the EU though the Africa-EU Partnership which adopted a "Joint Vision for 2030" at the 6th EU-AU Summit in February 2022. Meanwhile, 54 countries of the African Union have

signed the agreement on the Africa Continental Free

UE-UA en février 2022. L'Agence de développement de l'Union africaine (NEPAD) est appelée à jouer un rôle clé dans la réalisation de la vision de l'Afrique énoncée dans l'Agenda 2063.

Président Trump : quelle économie et quelle politique étrangère ?

À cinq semaines de l'inauguration du président Trump pour son deuxième mandat, alors que les nominations aux principaux postes ont déjà été annoncées, jusqu'à quel point peut-on réduire l'incertitude des prévisions tant dans le domaine de sa politique économique que dans celui de la politique étrangère? How much does the experience gained by Donald Trump during and since his first term allow us to speculate on a reduction of international disorder, particularly in regions that are currently major hotspots of conflict? Will the protectionist measures of the new administration be containable, and if so, how?

Final Debate

The final session of this edition of the WPC will allow speakers to highlight and emphasize some themes that, in their view, have been insufficiently addressed during the past three days.

ATELIER 1 : Économie et finance

A. CROISSANCE MONDIALE

I. Prévisions mitigées pour l'économie mondiale avant l'élection de Donald Trump

En octobre 2024, avant l'élection de M. Trump, les perspectives de croissance de l'économie mondiale restaient positives malgré une hausse continue des taux d'intérêt depuis 2022. La croissance devrait rester faible à moyen terme par rapport à la période 2000-2019, et nombre de développements fâcheux font peser des risques de baisse du PIB mondial, à savoir l'escalade des conflits, l'incertitude quant aux droits de douane et à la politique commerciale, la baisse des flux migratoires et le resserrement des conditions financières mondiales.

II. Conséquences probables de l'élection de Donald Trump sur l'économie mondiale

La victoire de Donald Trump a bouleversé les perspectives économiques mondiales qui, pour la plupart, devraient être considérablement aggravées par les politiques de Trump: droits de douane et politique commerciale, baisse des flux migratoires, resserrement des conditions financières mondiales. Le risque d'une escalade des conflits pourrait être atténué. Quatre raisons peuvent expliquer le resserrement des conditions financières mondiales:

- La baisse des flux migratoires pourrait entraîner une hausse de l'inflation aux États-Unis
- Les réductions d'impôts massives promises par Donald Trump devraient nourrir l'inflation aux États-Unis et, par conséquent, se propager à l'échelle mondiale
- L'augmentation des droits de douane, envisagée à la fois par les États-Unis et par les pays ciblés en guise de représailles, est également susceptible de favoriser l'inflation à l'échelle mondiale
- Sous l'effet d'une hausse de l'inflation mondiale, les taux réels et nominaux pourraient eux aussi augmenter

III. Peser les pour et les contre de l'élection de Donald Trump pour l'économie mondiale

À court terme, on peut craindre une augmentation des droits de douane et le renforcement des barrières commerciales, avec pour conséquence une hausse de l'inflation et des taux d'intérêt réels et nominaux. À long terme, l'élection de Donald Trump devrait favoriser une gouvernance imprévisible, un climat d'incertitude en matière de transactions et de négociations, et une dette publique incontrôlable. Des conséquences environnementales sont également à prévoir. Donald Trump ayant menacé à plusieurs reprises de se retirer de l'Accord de Paris. Pour autant, tout n'est pas noir, car la prochaine présidence de Trump pourrait se traduire par une déréglementation importante et un allègement de l'impôt sur les sociétés, sans oublier l'expansion budgétaire. À long terme, la productivité totale des facteurs, sous l'effet des investissements des entreprises et du financement de l'innovation, pourrait grimper en flèche, et les efforts promis par Trump, à condition qu'ils soient mis en œuvre, pour mettre fin aux guerres actuelles et prévenir de nouveaux conflits, pourraient stimuler la croissance mondiale.

WOKSHOP 1: Economy and Finance

A. GLOBAL GROWTH

I. Mixed projections for the global economy before Donald Trump's election

Before Mr.Trump's election in October 2024, the world economic growth outlook remained positive despite the ever-increasing interest rates since 2022. Growth was projected to remain at a weak level in the mid-term compared with the period 2000-2019, and several unwelcomed developments signaled multiple downside risks for world GDP, i.e. conflict escalation, tariffs and trade policy uncertainty, lower migration and global financial conditions tightening.

II. Likely consequences of Donald Trump's election for the global economy

Donald Trump's victory has unsettled the global economic prospects, with most of them likely to get significantly worsened by Trump's policies: tariffs and trade policy, lower migration, global financial conditions tightening. The risk of a conflict escalation only might be alleviated. Four reasons can be thought of to explain why global financial conditions might be tightening:

- Lower migration could raise inflation in the United States
- The massive tax cuts Donald Trump has promised are expected to fuel inflation in the United States, and consequently spread globally
- Increased tariffs, expected both from the United States and targeted countries as retaliations, are also likely to foster inflation on a global scale
- Due to higher global inflation, real and nominal rates too may increase

III. Weighing the pros and cons of Donald Trump's election for the world economy

In the short term, tariffs and trade barriers are feared to grow, leading to increasing inflation and higher real and nominal interest rates. In the long term, Donald Trump's election is expected to foster unpredictable governance, uncertainty regarding transactions and negotiations, and uncontrollable public debt. Environmental consequences too are likely to emerge with Donald Trump repeatedly threatening to withdraw from the Paris Agreement.

However, everything is not all doom and gloom, as Trump's next presidency may induce significant deregulation and corporate tax alleviation as well as budget expansion. In the long term, total factor productivity, through corporate investment and innovation financing, might surge, and Trump's promised efforts, providing they are implemented, to end present wars and prevent new conflicts might boost global growth.

B. STABILITÉ FINANCIÈRE

En dépit des progrès accomplis pour réorganiser le système financier, la stabilité financière demeure un défi majeur pour les dirigeants du G20. Les « bank runs » (paniques bancaires) représentent toujours un risque, comme l'a montré la crise bancaire de mars 2023, et la mise en œuvre de réformes réalementaires visant à corriger les faiblesses actuelles du système financier est plus que jamais nécessaire. En outre, la digitalisation du système financier et les avancées technologiques continues contribuent à accroître la complexité et l'interconnexion, accentuant ainsi les vulnérabilités opérationnelles. Alors que l'utilisation croissante de l'intelligence artificielle dans la finance pourrait être bénéfique pour les autorités et les établissements financiers, les points faibles de l'IA (sources de données d'entraînement peu claires, automaticité et vitesse accrues de l'IA générative) pourraient également avoir un impact négatif sur le système financier, d'autant plus que les cyber-attaques demeurent un défi de taille pour les établissements financiers.

ATELIER 2 : Énergie et climat

B. FINANCIAL STABILITY

Despite progress made to revamp the financial system, reaching financial stability remains a key challenge for G20 leaders. Bank runs still stand for a risk, as the March 2023 banking crisis showed, and implementing regulatory reforms to address current weaknesses in the financial system are more than ever needed. Moreover, digitalization of the financial system and ongoing technological advances contribute to greater complexity and interconnectedness, adding to operational vulnerabilities. While the growing use of artificial intelligence in finance could bring benefits for authorities and institutions, AI weak points (unclear training data sources, increased automaticity and speed of GenAl) could also impact negatively the financial system, all the more as cyber-attacks remain a critical challenge for financial

wokshop 2: Energy and Environment

The world is in polycrises and global efforts to limit environmental degradation are not delivering what science calls for as the world is in a +3,1°C average warming trajectory, with 1,5°C completely out of sight. Governments and industries now all understand what the challenges are, the consequences for themselves, what can be done and should be done, but developing effective plans, and turning them into effective action is not happening at the required pace and scale. Global decarbonization efforts are on a slowing path, and latest discussions in Washington, Brussels and EU capitals point to prioritizing the economy, industrial resilience and addressing social discontent with short lived measures. China remains both the super coal and clean tech champion, with a

mesures à court terme récemment adoptées. Les aouvernements mènent souvent des politiques contradictoires et fragmentées, la réglementation fait souvent défaut, les agendas sont contradictoires et la coopération mondiale n'a jamais été aussi faible. Le monde aura besoin d'investissements massifs dans les réseaux et la flexibilité, de transports plus propres et de nouvelles sources d'approvisionnement en matières premières, mais le rythme de ces investissements est trop lent. On observe toutefois des tendances positives du côté des entreprises et des technologies. Dans l'ensemble, les crises énergétiques sont désormais derrière nous, la sécurité énergétique reste une priorité politique et les aouvernements voient les avantages des technologies à faible teneur en carbone dans leurs systèmes énergétiques et de mobilité, au-delà du pétrole, du gaz et du charbon. Les institutions et les entreprises de premier plan restent partagées sur les tendances énergétiques futures, comme en témoigne le débat sur le pic de la demande de pétrole, de charbon et de gaz. Une transition harmonieuse nécessite a minima un dialogue renforcé entre les producteurs et les consommateurs, ainsi qu'une réduction progressive et maîtrisée des investissements

Les investissements dans les technologies propres augmentent fortement d'année en année, les énergies renouvelables sont massivement déployées, les capacités industrielles se développent principalement en Chine, mais aussi aux États-Unis et dans les pays de l'OCDE et les pays non membres de l'OCDE comme l'Inde. Une question fondamentale est de savoir si la croissance économique et la croissance de la demande d'électricité liée aux infrastructures numériques et cryptographiques ne vont pas neutraliser ces évolutions et entraver davantage la croissance de l'électrification, qui reste insuffisante et

possible perspective of a peak in its greenhouse gas emissions before 2030, while India's emissions continue to rise with serious concerns over its ability to limit coal expansions while massively continuing to roll out renewables. Meanwhile, the world is seeing more direct and indirect trade barriers, with clean techs increasingly central.

Governments have often contradicting and fragmented policies, regulation is often missing, there are conflicting agendas and global cooperation is weaker than ever. The world will need massive grid and flexibility investment, cleaner transports and additional raw material supplies, but these are not coming at the required pace. Nonetheless, there are some positive corporate and technological trends, and overall, the energy crises are now behind, with energy security remaining very high on policy agendas, and governments seeing the benefits of low carbon technologies in their energy and mobility systems, beyond oil, gas and coal. Leading institutions and companies remain divided about future energy trends, such as illustrated by the peak oil, coal and gas demand discussion. An orderly transition requires a minima a stronger producer-consumer dialogue and a managed and progressive phase down of upstream investment.

Clean tech investments are rising sharply year on year, renewables are massively deployed, industrial capacities are expanding primarily in China, but also in the United States and OECD and non OECD countries such as India. A fundamental question is whether economic growth and the growth in electricity demand from digital and crypto infrastructure will not outpace these developments and further impede the growth in electrification, which remains too little and too low.

While climate change is a daunting challenge, climate adaptation is now equally central to climate mitigation efforts. This calls for even large climate finance spending, and comes with pressing issues such as climate justice, robust and operational climate funds, a reform of the global financial system

to expand & ease & derisk access to finance, credible voluntary carbon markets, global CO2 pricing mechanisms, non-financial reporting standards by corporates, environmental protectionism, and to continue fostering mechanisms that make clean tech investment more attractive.

Against this backdrop, central issues to be addressed are: What are the low hanging fruits in a brutal world where cooperation is minimal? What shall be the priorities for governments and corporates in order to peak global greenhouse gas emissions in a hurry and foster biodiversity preservation? What are the best examples and practices to roll out clean tech deployment, to accelerate corporate decarbonization and what minimal cooperation needs to happen in order to accelerate climate action, environmental protection while ensuring the world remains reasonably open, energy security is provided, and affordability and access to energy and clean cooking for all are ensured? What are the future cooperation, or confrontation perspectives, between the EU, US, China and other OECD and non OECD powers?

Topics for discussion include electricity system flexibility tools, critical raw materials, hydrogen certification and scale up, CCUS, future of natural gas in electricity, industries and transport, decarbonization of maritime transport, global governance issues, and how to maintain minimal and effective cooperation between China, the EU, the US and the wider emerging economies, not least Brazil and South Africa, which will host the COP and G20 presidencies in 2025.

ATELIER 3:



Founder and Owner of Kreab Worldwide and Kunskapsskolan Education. He is a Board member of the Nobel Prize Outreach since 2011 and is a Member of the Royal Swedish Academy of Engineering Sciences, IVA. He was Chef de Cabinet of ICC, the world business organization (1973-1981) and Chairman of the Stockholm Chamber of Commerce (2010–2014). Recipient of the King of Sweden's Medal of the Twelfth Dimension in Blue Ribbon for achievements as business leader and entrepreneur. He has a BA from the University of Stockholm and is a graduate of the Owner/President Management Program from Harvard Business School.



ERLANGER, Steven

Chief Diplomatic Correspondent, Europe, for *The New York Times*, based in Berlin. Former London, Paris and Brussels Bureau Chief of The New York Times. He has served in numerous postings for The Times in Jerusalem, Prague, Washington, Moscow, Bangkok and New York where he served as Culture Editor for two years. Previously, he worked for The Boston Globe as European Correspondent, based in London. He also reported from Eastern Europe, Moscow and revolutionary Iran. He was a Teaching Fellow at Harvard University. He shared in a Pulitzer Prize for Explanatory Reporting for a series on Al Qaeda and global terrorism in 2002 and for International Reporting on Russia in 2017.



A distinguished pediatrician and reproductive health specialist, Dr Tuakli was the first African woman clinical professor in Pediatrics at Harvard Medical School where she contributed to the creation of a special Community Medicine Department at Children's Hospital of Boston, She was the Founder and Medical Director of CHILD Accra in Ghana, and her contributions to child health education in Africa and the USA have been lauded worldwide.



VARMA, Anurag

Senior Vice President and Head of Public Affairs and Business Development for Adani North America, part of India's largest infrastructure and logistics conglomerate. In this capacity, Anurag Varma shapes the company's partnerships and strategic growth in North America. VASWANI, Kamal R.



ZAGHOUANI, Douraid



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Abou Dabi

L'émirat, qui dispose d'importantes réserves de pétrole et de gaz naturel, prépare la transformation de son modèle économique à travers le programme Abu Dhabi Economic Vision 2030, qui doit le faire évoluer vers une économie fondée sur la connaissance et l'innovation. Lancé en février 2008, le projet de construction de la cité de Masdar est l'un des piliers de cette transformation ambitieuse et vise à positionner la ville comme une pionnière en matière d'énergies renouvelables.

Dans cette métropole hypermoderne qui n'était encore qu'un désert il y a quelques années, les gratte-ciels vertigineux côtoient des lieux traditionnels comme la Grande Mosquée Sheikh Zayed. Le Louvre Abou Dabi, inauguré en 2017, marque le désir affiché par Abou Dabi de rayonner sur le plan culturel et de devenir une destination touristique incontournable.

C'est la quatrième fois qu'Abou Dabi accueillera la World Policy Conference.

Abu Dhabi

Abu Dhabi is the federal capital of the United Arab Emirates. It is also the capital of the emirate of the same name which is the largest of the country's seven emirates. Settled in 1761, the city of Abu Dhabi was under Britain's protection from 1820 to 1971 when the United Arab Emirates declared its independence.

Abu Dhabi is the political and industrial center of the federation, with an economy largely based on oil exports. The emirate, which has significant oil and natural gas reserves, is preparing the transformation of its economic model through the Abu Dhabi Economic Vision 2030 program, which is intended to move it towards an economy based on knowledge and innovation. Launched in February 2008, the Masdar city construction project is one of the pillars of this ambitious transformation and aims to position the city as a pioneer in renewable energy.

In this hypermodern metropolis that was still a desert a few years ago, soaring skyscrapers stand side by side with traditional places such as the Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque. Louvre Abu Dhabi, inaugurated in 2017, marks Abu Dhabi's desire to shine on the cultural scene and become a must-see tourist destination.










The Park Hyatt Abu Dhabi Hotel
